Your last lung cancer screening at our facility was on .
This letter is to remind you that it is time to schedule your next screening appointment.

According to the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) guidelines, an annual lung screening is recommended for high-risk individuals for at least two years and until the age of 77. High risk individuals may have a greater incidence of getting lung cancer than those who are low risk. You are considered in the high-risk category if you meet the following criteria:

- Age 55 to 77
- Current smoker
- OR a former smoker that has quit within the last 15 years

Medicare and Medicaid Services and private insurance payors cover lung cancer screening for eligible individuals.

Although a CT examination is the most accurate method of early lung cancer detection, it does not detect all lung cancers. That's why it is important for you to have an ongoing relationship with a healthcare provider who can work with you on preventative measures and monitor your health for any changes. If you do not currently have a primary care provider, please call us so we can assist you in establishing a relationship with someone close to your home.
